

This Indenture made and concluded this 27<sup>th</sup> day July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four, between David George of the County of Amherst, of the one part, and James Bullock of Campbell & town of Lynchburg of the other part witnesseth that the said David George that in order to secure to Thomas Watt of Lynchburg the sum of fifteen pounds £5<sup>0</sup> due by bond bearing date this the 27<sup>th</sup> day of July 1804, & payable the 1<sup>st</sup> day October next, & for & in consideration of the sum of one dollar, to me in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained & sold, by these presents, doth grant bargain, and sell unto the said James Bullock his heirs or assigns for ever, the following property (to wit) two feather beds, bedsteads, and furniture, five chairs, one large iron Pot, one duck oven, one chest, of two tables; - To have and to hold, the said above described property, unto him the said James Bullock, his heirs or assigns & upon trust, & special confidence nevertheless that in case the said David George, his heirs executors or administrators, shall fail to pay the said sum of fifteen pounds £5<sup>0</sup> current money of Virginia, due by Bond as aforesaid unto the said Thos. Watt his heirs or assigns & or in case of any part may remain due & unpaid at the time aforesaid, being 1<sup>st</sup> day October next then in that case it may be lawful for the said James Bullock, or his legal representatives to sell the said above mentioned property, for ready money, to the highest bidder at the dwelling house of the said David George, or at some convenient public place near his residence, having advertised the time and place of sale, three weeks in some news paper, nearest the residence of the said George, & out of the monies arising from such sale, in the first place, to pay the said Thos. Watt the amount of the before mentioned Bond, with all legal interest, & costs that may have accrued thereon, and pay the expences of drawing & recording this Inventory, the surplus if any arising from said sale, to be paid to the said David George his heirs & of the said David George, for himself & his heirs, doth covenant & agree to, & with the said James Bullock, that in case of sale of the within described property that he will render peaceable possession of the same to the purchaser or purchasers, and that he will sign & execute any instrument of writing necessary for giving & making complete the title to the property. 


Tucker, the premises aforementioned to him his heirs & assigns for ever, & the said Isaac Tucker Elizabeth his wife, do hereby warrant & defend the right & title of said Lands, to the said Daniel in fee simple against the claim or claims of him the said Isaac, or any other person or persons whatever.
