

This Indenture made this 7th day of December the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and Twelve Between Richard Hatten of Amherst County of the one part & George P. Lucke of said County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Richard Hatten for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & Eight Dollars to him in hand paid by the said George P. Lucke the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath bargained sold and confirmed unto the said George P. Lucke his heirs or assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing Fifty four Acres by Survey being dated the Twenty third day of October 1799 lying and being in the County of Amherst on the South Branches of Hensleys Creek, and bounded as follows to wit - beginning at Pointers corner to William Cahells old line and with thence S. 87 E. 50 Poles to Pointers S. 77 E. 94 poles to a white oak thence new line S. 69 E. 36 Poles to a pine S. 7 W. 6 poles to Pointers in Philip Peyton old line and with it S. 77 W. 88 poles to a red oak in Richard Elliotts old line and with it N. 3 W. 19 Poles to a pine S. 89 W. 90 Poles to Pointers in W. Patris old line and with it N. 25 W. 79 poles to Pointers thence a new line N. 60 E. 48 Poles to the first Station with all its appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract and parcel of Land with its appurtenances to the said Geo. P. Lucke his heirs or assigns forever and the said Richard Hatten for himself and his heirs doth covenant and agree with the said George P. Lucke and his heirs that the above sold Land and Premises will forever warrant and defend unto the said George P. Lucke his heirs forever from all humors and from the title or claim of any Person or Persons whatsoever.
