 or parcel of Land containing one hundred and thirty acres be the  
 same more or less situate lying and being in the County of Yorkland  
 on the North side James River and on the head of the Westmost  
 Branch of Currahoe Creek and part of a tract of Land formerly taken  
 up by Charles Lavans in his own name and bounded as followeth  
 viz, Beginning at a lower Road oak being Allen Edwards nearest  
 corner to the head of Currahoe there on the said Edwards line  
 which divides him from the said William and John Knight to a  
 corner stone placed in the former dividing line between Joseph  
 Woodson and Charles Lavans there on the said dividing line to the  
 southernmost line of the said tract of Land and crossing the Easternmost
