

Face of Adam bargain sold Euseffs & confirm unto the aforesaid John Worsham his heirs and assigns for ever all the right title and Interest of him the said George Worsham in and to one hundred and thirty acres lying and being in the County of Henrico at a place called Nuttaps and bounded as follows Beginning at a corner black Oak passing the said George Worsham and John Jones thence South West and by South forty nine poles to a corner black Oak then South one hundred poles to a corner white Oak dividing the said George Worsham and James Hills his share on the one side and the said John Jones thence East seven degrees South one hundred and thirty eight poles to a corner white Oak thence North one hundred thirty eight poles to a corner white Oak dividing the said George Worsham and John Jones thence East seven degrees South one hundred and thirty eight poles to the first corner **To have and to hold** the said one hundred and thirty acres with all woods waters houses gardens fences and all other privileges profits and benefits whatsoever to the said John Worsham his heirs and assigns for ever without any let hinderance or molestation whatsoever from him the said George Worsham or from any other person or persons whatsoever claiming or to claim from him or by his agent or procurement And further the said George Worsham doo for himself his heirs assigns and assigns agree with the said John Worsham his heirs and assigns that he the said George Worsham doo warrant and maintain the quiet and peaceable possession of the said land and premises unto the aforesaid John Worsham his heirs and assigns for ever **In witness** whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this

In a Court held for Henrico County the 17th day of April 1719
 George Worsham acknowledged the Deed to be his deed and Deed and thereupon the said Deed with the hereunto set and endorsed which he also acknowledged were returned to record.

This Indenture made this 17th day of December 1717 between Robert Napier of Henrico County of the one part & Nicholas Cox of Charles City County of the other part **Witnesseth** That for & in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty pounds lawful money to the said Napier in hand paid by the said Cox at the one speaking and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & for divers other good causes & considerations he the said Napier therewith especially moving to the said Napier hath granted bargain & sold & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said Cox & his heirs all that tract or parcel of Land situate lying & being in Henrico County and bounding as follows (viz.)

beginning at the mouth of Torrens branch on Tuckahoe brook thence up the branch as it meanders to Eliphs back line of his now Deceased thence along the said line the South all four poles to two pine saplings on the East side of Hardings branch being the dividing of this Land from that tract lawfully bought of Tho: Harding thence down the said Hardings branch as it meanders to the mouth thereof thence down the said branch of Tuckahoe to the place begun at being the said the said Napier bought of John Ellis of Henrico County & the Remainder & Residue & Remains & Residue & profits of the said Messuages or Tenement & premises unto the said Cox & his heirs from the feast of St. Michael last next before the date of these presents for & during unto the full end & term of one whole year from thence next ensuing fully to be completed & ended Yielding & paying throughout the rent of one penny on the feast of St. Michael next if the same shall be lawfully demanded to the intent that by virtue of these presents & by force of the Statute for transferring of uses into possession made & provided the said Cox may be in the actual possession of the said messuages or Tenement & premises & may be thereby enabled to have a grant & release of the Inheritance thereof to him & his heirs for ever to & for the intents & purposes intended to be limited & declared in certain Indentures of release & Confirmation intended to be made the day next after the date of these presents & to be made between the said Napier of the one part & the said Cox of the other part **In witness** whereof he the said Napier hath hereunto set his hand & seal January 31st 1717

This Indenture made this 17th day of December 1717 between Robert Napier of Henrico County of one part & Nicholas Cox of Charles City County of the other part **Witnesseth** That for & in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty pounds lawful money to the said Napier by the said Cox in hand well & truly paid the receipt whereof he the said Napier doth hereby acknowledge & thereof of every part thereof doth acquit release and discharge the said Cox his heirs &c. for ever by these presents & for & in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty pounds lawful money to the said Napier in hand well & truly paid by the said Cox the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & the said sum of five hundred and fifty pounds are the consideration money of certain Indentures purporting to be a bargain & sale of the messuages or Tenement hereafter mentioned to be hereby granted & released from the said Napier to the said Cox his heirs & assigns for ever to the uses hereof for mentioned & for divers other good causes & considerations to the said Napier therewith especially moving to the said Napier hath granted bargain & sold aliened released & confirmed & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell alien & confirm unto the said Cox his heirs & assigns for ever all that tract or
